HAVDALAH CANDLE CRAFT:

AGES 2-5

MATERIALS

- 1. Foam tube or toilet paper tube
- 2. Multi-colored strings
- 3. Yellow & glittery card stock paper

- 1. Cut out a flame shape from the yellow card stock.
- 2. Cut out a smaller flame shape from the gold glittery card stock.
- 3. Glue the glittery flame shape on top of the yellow flame shape
- 4. While the flames are hardened, prepare the candle stick by wrapping the tube with at least three different colored strings. (More or less colors is also good)
- 5. Stick the flame to the inside top opening of the tube and you have a beautiful Havdalah candle the kids can take home.



HAVDALAH SPICE BOX CRAFT:





MATERIALS

- 1. Small cardboard box
- 2. Spices of your choice
- 3. Stickers
- 4. Markers, crayons, and/or paints
- 5. Scotch tape

- 1. Punch a few holes on the top of your spice box
- 2. Have kids decorate the spice box to their liking
- 3. Gather spices such as lemon peel, cinnamon, and ginger and help kids place the spices in the box
- 4. Glue the top of the box so kids can't open it (and eat it)
- 5. Enjoy the aroma of the spices through the top holes on the box



HAVDALAH CANDLE CRAFT:

AGES 6-9

MATERIALS

- 1. 2-3 Hanukkah candles
- 2. Styrofoam cup
- 3. Warm water
- 4. Aluminum foil

- 1. Bring your candles together and dip the bottom half in warm water. Wait until the color in the water begins to change.
- 2. Push the candles together and dip the top half of the candles in the warm water.
- 3. Push the candles together and begin to twist them around each other. (You might need to try this a few times - with different candles - until you get it right)
- 4. Mold the candle to your desired shape
- 5. Wrap the bottom of the candle with aluminum foil
- 6. Light the candle and say the Havdalah blessing.



HAVDALAH SPICE BAG CRAFT:

AGES 6-9

MATERIALS

- 1. Mesh or plastic bag
- 2. Ribbons
- 3. Combination of different spices to choose from





- 1. Lay out a buffet of different spices. Some options could be: cinnamon sticks, lemon peels, ginger, orange zest, rosemary, mint, sage, cumin, pumpkin spice, lavender, nutmeg, cardamom, etc.
- 2. (Optional) Do a smell guess test. See if you can guess which spices you are smelling.
- 3. Take your time smelling and choosing your favorite spices
- 4. Gather your 3 5 of your favorite spices into the bag
- 5. Bunch up the top of the bag and seal it with a rubber band and/or a ribbon Enjoy your new Havdalah spices.



HAVDALAH KIDDUSH CUP CRAFT: ALL AGES


MATERIALS
